Sebastian Lozano was born in Los Angeles, California and graduated from South Pasadena High School.

In 2010, Sebastian enlisted in the United States Navy where he served for 5 years as an air traffic controller. While in the Navy, Sebastian became a full qualified air traffic controller and served as a Facility Watch Supervisor while on deployment at Diego Garcia between 2014 and 2015. Sebastian was also made Lead Victim Advocate of the Navy's Sexual Assault Prevention and Response program while deployed overseas. Upon completion of his service in 2015, Sebastian was awarded the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal for his leadership while on deployment.

After the Navy, Sebastian first entered representative government as an intern for Los Angeles City Councilmember David Ryu in 2016 and was eventually hired on as a full-time Council Aide based at the Sherman Oaks Field Office until 2017. In 2018, he joined the office of Assemblymember Richard Bloom as an Office Assistant. Upon graduation in 2019, he was hired on as a full-time Field Representative and oversaw Veterans Affairs, Transportation, K-12 Education, Labor, and Latino issues within the 50th Assembly District. He also chaired the Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) Taskforce for the Assemblymember, which is a taskforce charged with overseeing safety improvements along the PCH from Santa Monica to the Ventura County Line. In 2023, Sebastian joined the office of Assemblymember Laura Friedman as her District Director and oversaw district operations while also training and leading new field reps. on how to provide constituent services. In 2024, Sebastian was hired as newly elected Assemblymember Mark González's District Director. Sebastian is the Assemblymember's top liaison to local elected officials, business leaders, and community leaders in the cities of Los Angeles, Vernon, Commerce, and Montebello.

Throughout his life and career, he has remained committed to public service and a belief in government to engage communities in creating equitable and sustainable communities.

Sebastian is married to Jalima Maldonado and lives in the Los Angeles neighborhood of El Sereno. He enjoys reading historical non-fiction and cooking for his family. You can catch him at Dodger games or looking for new food spots around LA.
